Dear Parents/Carers

Once again sport has been high on the agenda at school this week with a group of children from across Years 5 & 6 travelling to the leisure centre to take part in the local Sportshall Athletics Competition. Fresh from our recent award as 'Active School Of The Year' Hinckley Parks is certainly acquiring something of a reputation for it's sporting participation and success and this could be seen again as the children competed in track events such as a 1 by 1 Relay, 2 by 2 Relay, 6 lap Paarluf, and an Obstacle Relay as well as field events such as Javelin, Chest Push, Long Jump, Triple Jump and Speed Bounce. The children were a credit to the school, showing resilience, determination and pride. Overall we came 7th in the whole of the Hinckley and Bosworth area, which is a massive achievement—well done to all involved.

It was an absolute pleasure this week to work with Mr Goode's Local History Group. This group meet after school each Thursday and this week their studies were focused on the history of our school.
